PETITION subject matter: Ninefoot Lane Belgrave Tamworth

Further to my letter of 16 July 2010 I can advise that Local Councillors; Robert Pritchard and Richard McDermid and the Councillor Portfolio Holder for Community Safety; Brian Beale met on 20 July to discuss the petition received on 9 July. Tamworth Borough Council has no direct control with regard to imposing parking restrictions on local roads. Your petition is about something that Staffordshire County Council is responsible for. However Councillor Pritchard was able to advise those present that the issue related to the hammer head area in Ninefoot Lane which already has "KEEP CLEAR" signs painted on the road, and that the signage is not preventing vehicles being parked in that area. Accordingly the petition will be forwarded to the County Council with a request that they look at introducing parking restrictions in the hammer head area at Ninefoot Lane.

If you feel that your petition has not been dealt with properly, you have the right within ten working days of obtaining this decision, to request that the Council's Community and Wellbeing Scrutiny Committee review the steps that have been taken in response to your petition. It will be helpful to everyone, and can improve the prospects of a review if you give a short explanation of the reasons why the above response is not considered to be adequate.
