The grounds of the application for review are:

**On 27 September 2013, the St George sold alcohol to a volunteer who was under the age of 18. No identification or any proof of age was sought by staff. Additionally, there have been 11 crime and disorder incidents in the last 12 months. Staffordshire Police believe that the Premises License Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor have failed to promote the licensing objectives namely, the Protection of Children from Harm and Prevention of Crime and Disorder and need to do more to meet their obligation.**
