Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

A Mandatory Conditions: Where licence authorises supply of alcohol. "On" or "on and off" supplies

- (1) Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions:
- (2) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

B Mandatory Condition: Exhibition of Films

- (1) Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- (2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
- (3) Where -
 - (a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - (b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

- (4) In this section -

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

C Mandatory Condition: Door Supervision

- (1) Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that

each such individual must be

- (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
 - (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of Section 4 of that Act.
- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed -
- (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to -
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act (see section 3 (2) of that Act) (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

D Mandatory Condition: Irresponsible Promotions

1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone,

- encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

E Mandatory Condition: Free Potable Water to be provided on request to customers

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

F Mandatory Condition: Requirement for an Age Verification Policy

3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

G Mandatory Condition: The requirement for small measures of beer, cider, wine and spirits to be made available

4. The responsible person must ensure that –
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

H Mandatory Condition: Sale of Alcohol Below the Cost of VAT and Duty

- 1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 –
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula -
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where –
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4 (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1 The restrictions on the hours for the supply of alcohol do not prohibit:
 - a) during the first 20 minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - b) consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
 - c) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - d) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - e) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
 - f) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - g) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
 - h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

- 2 Not more than the following number of persons shall be permitted to be on the premises at any one time:

200 persons

Conditions Applicable to all Licensing Objectives

- 3 No alcohol shall be served before 12:00 hours.
- 4 All licensable activities shall take place indoors.
- 5 Details of sale of age restricted goods shall be clearly displayed in the premises.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

- 6 CCTV shall be installed internally and externally and operated in accordance with the digital specification and directions of the Chief Constable.
- 7 The CCTV system shall operate internally to cover all internal areas where licensable activities take place.
- 8 The time and date of the CCTV system will be set to the correct time relating to BST/GMT.
- 9 A competent person trained in the use of and operation of the CCTV system will be in attendance at the premises at all times that licensable activities take place and be able to fully operate the CCTV system, to be able to down load in a recognised format any information requested by the Police

- 10 A facility will be available for the Police to remove from the CCTV system a copy of any material relevant to any ongoing Police investigation.
- 11 Any material will be capable of being viewed on a standard DVD player.
- 12 Clear signage will be displayed at all entrances and exits to include fire exits indicating that CCTV is in operation.
- 13 All CCTV images will be retained for a period of not less than 31 days.
- 14 There will be an electronic till used at the premises which will record on a receipt the exact time and date of any transactions.
- 15 An incident register of all occurrences and ejections from the premises will be maintained at the premises and any details of public disorder will be recorded. The register will be produced and made available for inspection upon request by a responsible authority.
- 16 A detailed Customer Code of Conduct poster will be displayed at the entrance of the premises warning persons that if they act in an inappropriate manner they could be barred from the premises.
- 17 A detailed sale of age restricted products poster will be displayed at the entrance of the premises.
- 18 In the absence of the designated premises supervisor there will always be at least one member of staff on duty inside the premises who is over the age of 21 and the holder of a personal licence to sell alcohol. Such a person will be in charge and present at the premise on the written authority of the designated premises supervisor.
- 19 All persons involved in the sale of alcohol who are not the holder of a personal licence to sell alcohol shall receive initial and regular 6 monthly refresher training by the designated premises supervisor with regards to the law in relation to the sale of alcohol. Such training shall be recorded and up to date training records of all such persons shall be maintained at the premises and produced and made available for inspection upon request by a responsible authority.
- 20 Crime prevention literature will be displayed in the premises.
- 21 The premises shall be members of the Tamworth Pub Watch scheme (or similar) attend all meetings as posted by the scheme as far as is practicable, fully agree to any protocols in force by the scheme and operate the town centre radio when the premises are open for trade.
- 22 There shall be no "all inclusive" drinks promotions permitted on the premises.
- 23 Door supervision shall be provided in accordance with the Security Industry Authority guidelines and advice, including:
 - i) Door supervisors shall be on duty from not later than 21:00 hours until the close of business and all customers having departed the premises on a Thursday, Friday and Saturday night and any other nights when regulated entertainment is taking place. A ratio of door supervisors of 1:75 persons in accordance with SIA recommended guidelines.
 - ii) Door supervisors shall wear high visibility work jackets at all times, when working.
 - iii) A full record of door staff on duty and of any incidents occurring shall be kept by the designated premises supervisor or appointed deputy, and made available at all times for inspection, upon request, to representatives of the Responsible Authorities.

Public Safety

- 24 First aid boxes and equipment shall be available at all times on the premises.
- 25 No person shall be allowed to take any vessels containing alcoholic drinks from the premises and any designated outside seating area(s).
- 26 All vessels shall be removed from the public area(s) as soon as possible.
- 27 All fire system equipment, including fire resisting structures, shall be in place.
- 28 No further alcohol shall be sold to any customers who, in the opinion of trained bar staff, appear to have consumed an excessive amount of alcohol.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 29 There shall be no external speakers used.
- 30 Noise limiting deterrents shall be installed in accordance with any requirements expressed by Tamworth Borough Council.
- 31 No noise shall be directed outside of the building.
- 32 All external doors shall be fitted with self-closing mechanisms, except fire doors.
- 33 Cigarette butt receptacles shall be provided outside the premises for the use of customers.
- 34 Highways near to the premises shall be cleaned and swept as is appropriate.

The Protection of Children from Harm

- 35 There shall be no "adult" entertainment in the premises.
- 36 Any person under the age of 16 years shall be supervised by a responsible adult whilst on the premises.
- 37 No person under 18 years of age shall be allowed into the premises after 22:00 hours.
- 38 A Challenge 25 policy shall be adopted and enforced at the premises. All persons who appear to be under the age of 25 will be challenged for suitable identification to prove they are over the age of 18, prior to purchasing alcohol.
- 39 The only acceptable forms of ID that shall be accepted are:
 - A. Valid photo ID driving licence
 - B. Valid Passport
 - C. Valid PASS ID card.
- 40 Challenge 25 signs shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises and at the cash till/ payment area.

- 41 All refusals of sales shall be recorded in either a recognised Refusal of Sales register, or by means of an electronic recording system which will be maintained at the premises. The register or electronic record will be produced and made available for inspection upon request by a responsible authority.

Door Supervisors

A written record must be kept on the premises by the Designated Premises Supervisor of every person employed on the premises as a door supervisor in a register kept for that purpose. That record must contain the following details:

- The door supervisor's name, date of birth and home address
- Their security Authority licence number
- The time, date they start and finish duty
- Each entry must be signed by the door supervisor

Hi visibility clothing must be worn by all door supervisor's whilst on duty

Where an external door company is used the register must also include the company name, address and contact number.

The register must be kept fully updated at all times and remain at the licensed premises and be available for inspection at the time of the visit by any Responsible Authority.

A minimum of 2 Security Industry Authority (SIA) registered door supervisors and thereafter 1:75 customers must be present when the premises are open for trade on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays and any Sunday prior to a bank holiday, Christmas Eve or New Year's Eve from 21:00 hours and must remain at the premises until such time the premises are closed and all members of public have left the venue.

CCTV

CCTV must be installed and operating correctly to manufacturer's instructions internally and externally and must cover all public entrances/exits and public areas where licensable activity takes place whilst the premises is open to the public. This must include all areas that smokers are allowed to congregate.

The time and date must be set to the correct time relating to BST/GMT

The picture must be clear enough to identify people's facial features.

A competent trained person in the use of and operation of the CCTV must be in attendance at the premises at all times that licensable activities take place and be able to fully operate the CCTV system to be able to down load at the time of the visit onto a CD/DVD/USB stick any information requested by any Responsible Authority.

All CCTV images must be retained for a period of not less than 31 days.

Clear signage must be displayed at all entrance and exits indicating that CCTV is in operation.

Weekly checks must be made of the operation of the CCTV system to confirm that it is working correctly and such checks are to be recorded in a register which is to be signed by the person conducting the check. This record must be kept fully updated at all times and remain on the premises for inspection at the time of the visit by any Responsible Authority.

Notice of nomination

There must be an up to date record maintained on the premises, by the Designated Premises Supervisor, of every person who has been authorised to sell alcohol. That record must be signed and dated by the Designated Premises Supervisor and made available at the time of the visit to any Responsible Authority.

Drugs

The Designated Premises Supervisor must at the request of the Police display promotional material regarding drug awareness and any incidents involving drugs must be reported to the police.

Incident Register

An incident register of all occurrences and ejections from the premises must be maintained at the premises and any details of any incidents of crime or disorder or misuse of drugs offences must be recorded. The register must be produced and made available at the time of the visit to any responsible authority.

Training

Prior to selling alcohol, all persons involved in the sale of alcohol & age restricted products who are not the holder of a Personal Licence must receive initial and regular six monthly refresher training by the Designated Premises Supervisor or external training provider with regards to the law in relation to the sale of alcohol & age restricted products. Such training must be recorded and up to date training records of all such persons must be maintained at the premises and produced and made available at the time of the visit to any Responsible Authority. There must be eighteen months records retained.

Public Safety

There must be no opened vessels containing any alcoholic/non-alcoholic drinks taken from the boundaries of the premises.

All glasses and bottles must be removed from the public areas after they are finished with or are empty.

Public Nuisance

A notice advising customers to leave the premises quietly and respect the needs of residents must be displayed at each of the exits of the premises.

A notice advising customers to be quiet and respect the needs of residents must be displayed in all outside drinking/smoking areas.

Last Entry

No person must be allowed admittance to the premises after 02.00 Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Sunday or 02.30 hours Thursday, Friday and Saturday except for persons temporarily exiting the premises for the purposes of smoking and the premises must take all necessary steps to ensure that after that time only persons who have temporarily left the premises to smoke are allowed back inside the venue.

Protection of Children

A Challenge 25 policy must be adopted and enforced at the premises where all persons who appear to be under the age of 25 must be challenged for acceptable identification to prove they are over the age of 18 prior to the purchase of alcohol.

The only acceptable forms of identification are a valid photo driving licence, valid passport or a valid PASS approved proof of age card.

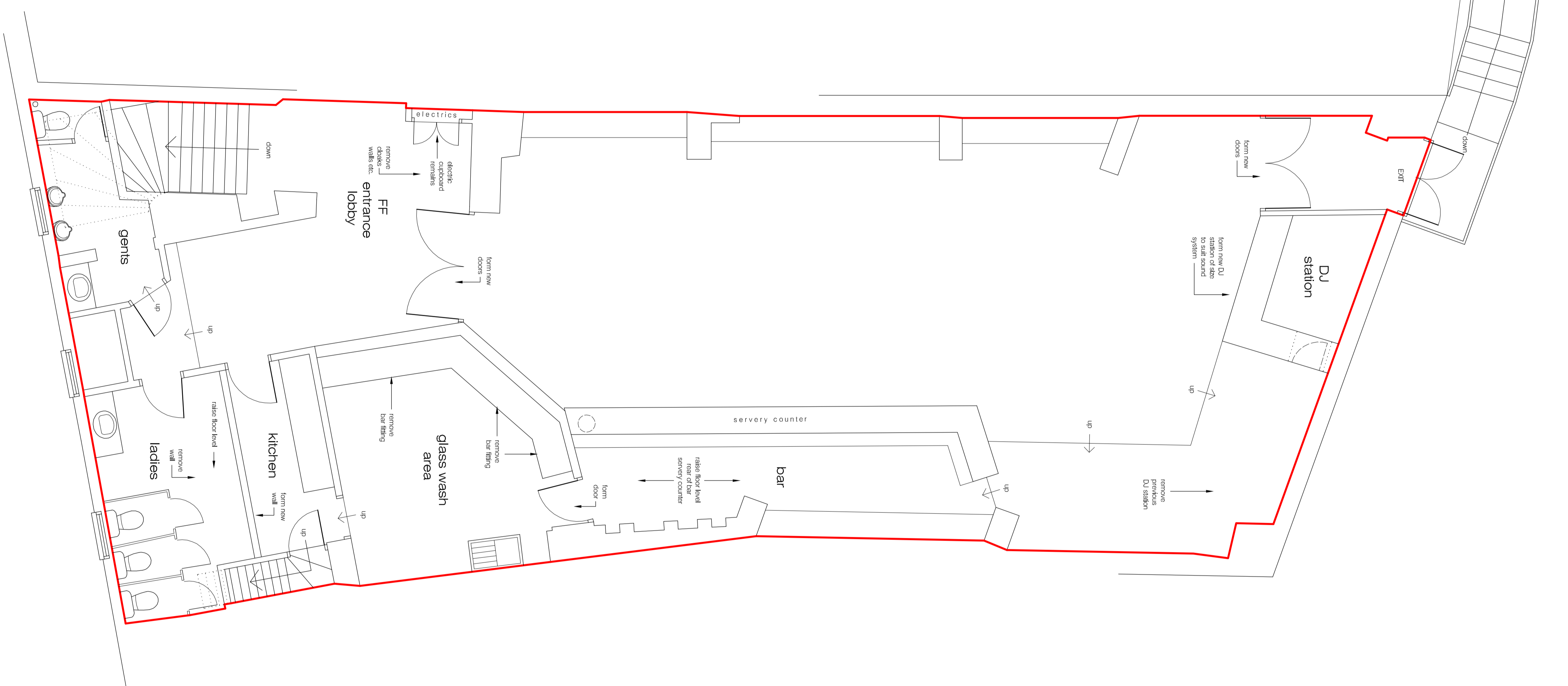

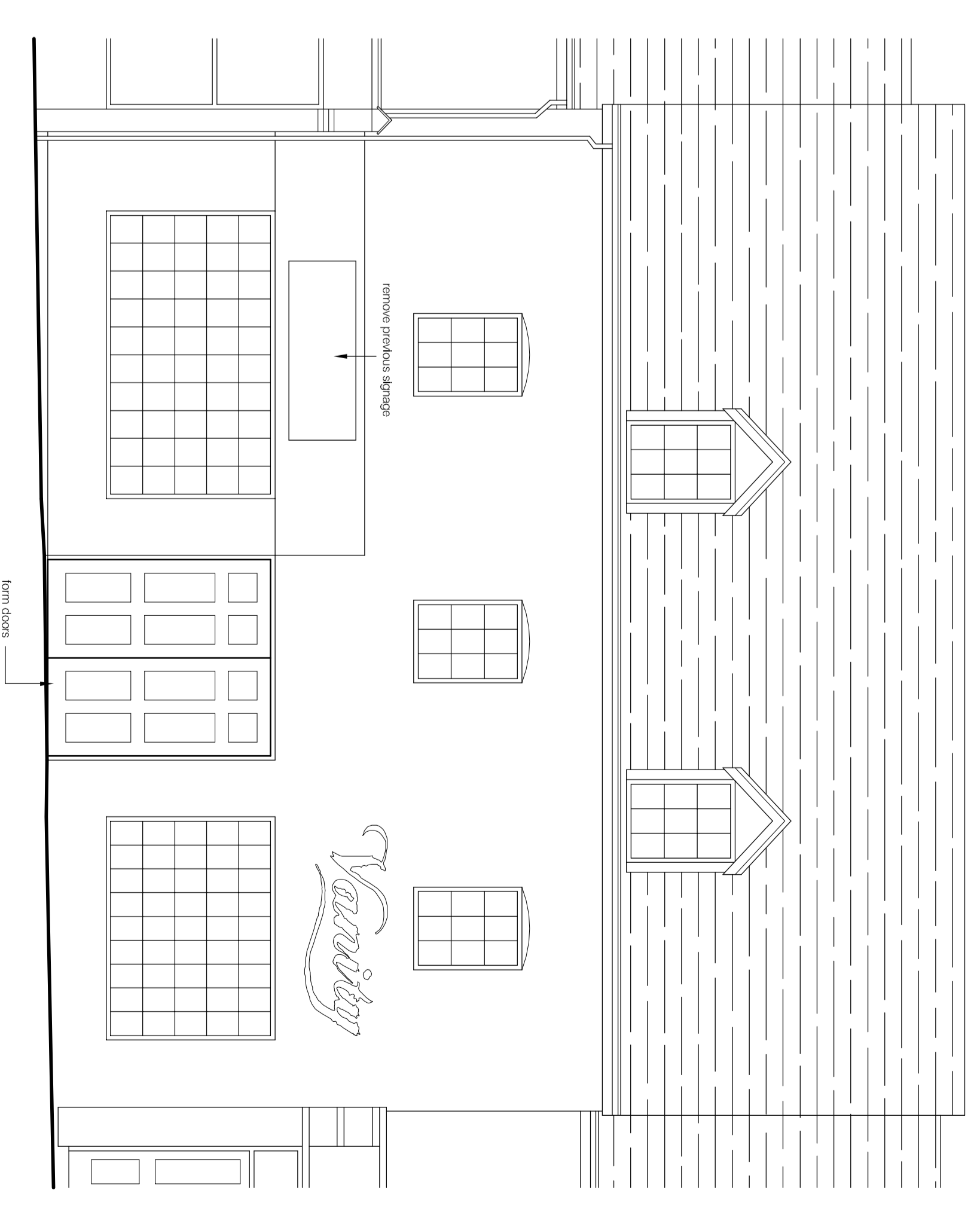

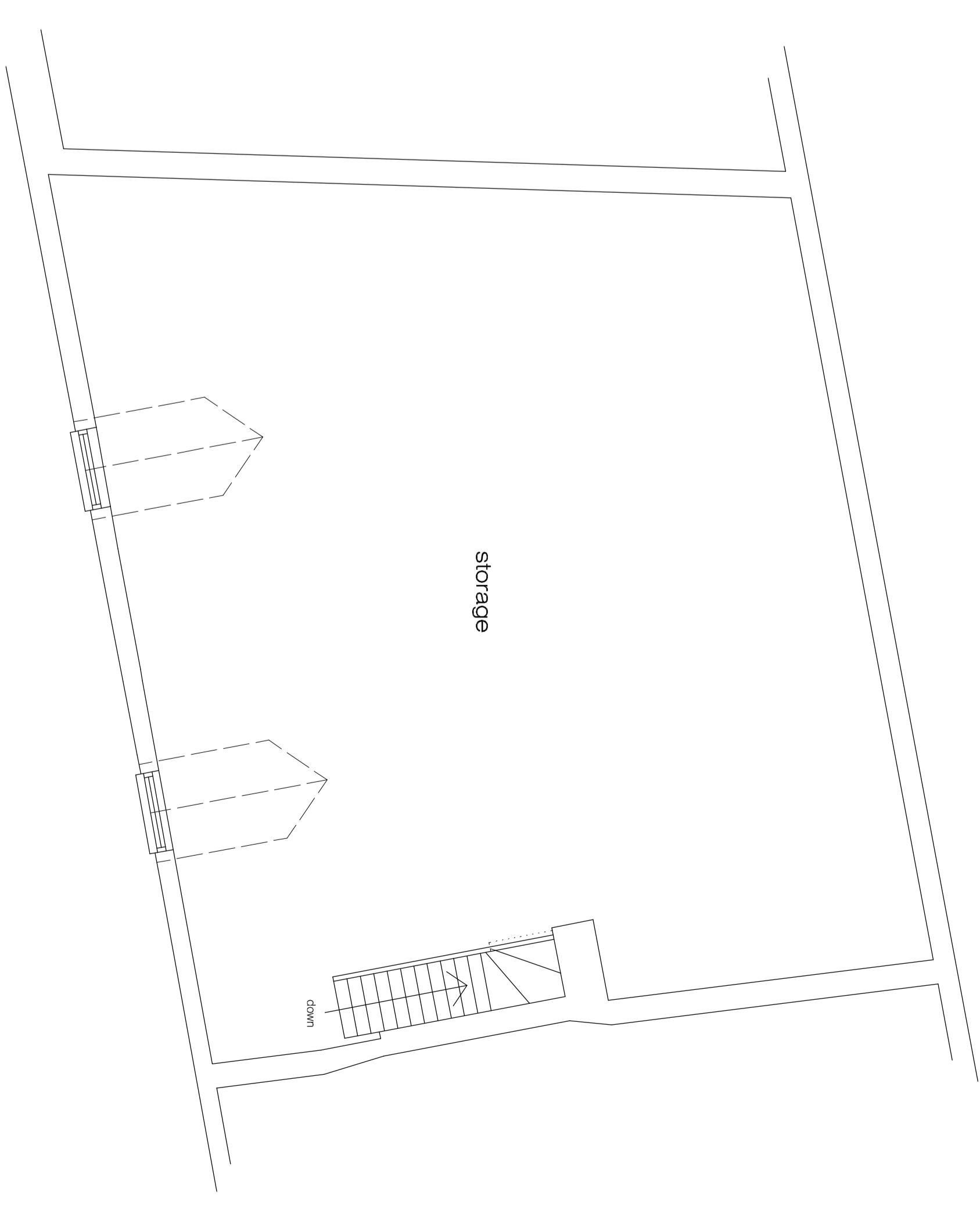
proposed ground floor plan 1:50
