

The recommendations for improvement are being actioned and reported on to senior leadership and Cabinet Members.

There is a strong sense of pride among those who met with the peer team about Tamworth, its ancient origins, and unique heritage. The council is ambitious for the future, with major regeneration projects underway to transform the town centre.



SOCIAL HOUSING The council triggered a self-referral to the Regulator for Social Housing

due to issues of non-compliance with required standards. Positive initial progress has been achieved following this. Α

The council responded rapidly and effectively to violent disorder at a local hotel housing asylum seekers, and have commissioned an 'honest conversations' project to improve community cohesion.



COLLABORATION There is good joint-working between senior officers and cabinet members.



EXTERNAL INVESTMENT

The council has successfully attracted external investment to regenerate Tamworth Town Centre, including funding from the Future High Streets Fund and other sources.
